#### Community Engagement: Highlights from Our September & October Outreach Events

September and October were busy months for our team, as we organized and attended a variety of events. We started September off in Fort Worth, Texas, attending a conference hosted by the Mobile Health Association. The conference offered our team a slew of information regarding the launch and sustainability of our mobile health services, vehicle maintenance, program evaluation and quality, and how to best deliver equitable services to our rural community.



Upon return, our team hosted a public meeting on September 27th at Manchester Elementary School, to present information and answer questions regarding the launch of primary care mobile health clinic. Our team also had the opportunity to show off the mobile clinic vehicle on September 28th at the "I Am Democracy" event in Manchester. During the event, we gave tours of the vehicle and shared information regarding program sponsorship to fund the equipment and supplies needed to deliver services.

In October, MHA hosted the Annual All-Schools Health Fair at Point Arena High School. We were joined by hundreds of local children and youth, their teachers, and school administrators. Later in October, our team hosted a Speakers Panel at the Arena Theater for 6th through 9th grade students. The purpose of the panel was to provide local youth with information about preventing substance use and addiction, and to connect them to local and regional resources that can contribute to a healthy life free of addiction. The panel, which was MCed by our own Jake Petrykowski, Peer Recovery Coordinator, featured five dynamic individuals in recovery – Shawn Horn, Efi Benjamin, Angela Tejeda, John Duran, and Lorenzo Torres – each with an inspirational story to share. The panel also featured subject matter expert, Scott Gerbert, Director of Outreach and Strategic Partnerships for the Stanford Medicine REACH Lab, Division of Adolescent Medicine, who delivered important information to students regarding support, harm reduction, stigma and positive ways to seek happiness.
